vou will need

- pencils / crayons
- textas / pens
- paint
- dice

Do you read comics or watch cartoons? Do you have a favourite picture book or read stories that have illustrated characters? What do the characters have in common? Do you like the way they are drawn? What would you change?

steps

- 1. What will your monsters body look like? Draw a large shape to begin.
- 2. Roll the dice. What number did you roll? If you rolled a three, draw three heads on your body, if you rolled a two, draw two and so on.
- 3. Roll the dice again. Add the number of eyes you rolled.
- 4. Roll the dice again. Add the number of mouths you rolled.
- 5. Roll the dice again. Add the number of noses you rolled.
- 6. By now your monster should be looking very whacky. Some more things you could roll the dice for are the monster's ears, ponytails, tongues, arms and legs!
- 7. Colour in your whacky monster in unusual colours, don't be afraid to experiment!
