

Exhibition information and ticketing

What are the exhibition dates?

Facing Modernity: From Degas to Picasso is open from Saturday May 23 to Sunday September 20.

What are the exhibition hours?

Facing Modernity is open daily from 10am – 4pm, and open late on Fridays until 7pm.

Exhibition tickets can be booked for timed sessions at 10am, 11am, 12pm, 1pm, 2pm, and 3pm every day, and 4pm, 5pm, and 6pm each Friday.

Why do I have to buy tickets for a specific time?

Timed ticketing helps to enhance your visitor experience by minimising long queues and waiting times whilst ensuring safe capacity limits are maintained in the exhibition. Most visitors will be able to enjoy the whole exhibition in less than 1 hour.

Is the museum open every day?

Shepparton Art Museum will be open 7 days a week during the *Facing Modernity* and the *Archibald Prize 2026* exhibitions. This will commence on 23 May until 1 November 2026.

When do tickets go on sale?

Ticket bookings will open at 10am on Thursday 23 April. To register your interest in tickets, sign up to our [mailing list](#).

Where can I buy tickets?

We strongly encourage purchasing tickets online prior to your arrival. Tickets can be purchased online by visiting our [exhibition page](#).

You can also purchase tickets in person ahead of time by visiting the Ticket Desk on SAM's ground floor.

Subject to capacity, a limited number of tickets will be available for purchase at the ticketing desk on the day. There may be long waiting times for these tickets. To avoid disappointment, or waiting, we strongly recommend you book ahead of time either online or in person.

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How much do tickets cost?

Ticket prices depend on the type of ticket you purchase. The types of tickets available are:

- **Single ticket:** A ticket that grants the ticket holder timed entry to one exhibition on a specified date and time.
- **Double-pass ticket:** A ticket that grants the ticket holder entry to both *Facing Modernity* and *Archibald Prize 2026* during one visit on a specified date and time (can only be used between 5 September – 20 September 2026).
- **Multi-pass ticket:** A flexible ticket available to Greater Shepparton residents and Friends of SAM members that grants the ticket holder five entries to paid exhibitions. The multi-pass ticket can be used across both *Facing Modernity* and *Archibald Prize 2026*.

Who is eligible for Concession tickets?

Concession tickets are valid for:

- Full time TAFE and University students upon presentation of a valid student ID
- Pensioner Concession card holders
- Health Care card holders
- Commonwealth Seniors Health card holders
- Seniors card holders
- Veteran Affairs card holders (DVA gold card)
- Members of public galleries and museums throughout Australia

Do I still need to book tickets for my children if they can enter for free?

Yes. If you are attending with children, you will need to book free tickets on their behalf. This helps ensure safe capacity limits are maintained.

Do you offer discounts or free entry to companion card holders?

Yes, companion card holders receive a second complimentary ticket for their companion. The card holder will need to purchase a concession ticket.

If you are purchasing this ticket online, you do not need to purchase a second ticket for your companion. Please see staff at the SAM Ticket Desk on our Ground Level and present your companion card to

receive a complimentary companion ticket.

Are there reciprocal discounts to Facing Modernity for members of other galleries?

Yes, members of public museums and galleries throughout Australia, including state and regional institutions, receive concession price tickets to *Facing Modernity*.

How does the multi-pass ticket work?

Multi-pass tickets are available for Greater Shepparton residents and current Friends of SAM members. These passes must be purchased in-person at SAM's Ticket Desk on the Ground Floor of the SAM building. This multi-pass ticket gives you five visits to *Facing Modernity: Degas to Picasso* and *Archibald Prize 2026*.

I want to bring my friends and family to see Facing Modernity/Archibald Prize. Can they all just use my multi-pass?

No – the multi-pass is designed for an individual to enter our ticketed exhibitions flexibly. Your visiting friends and family can book their tickets online ahead of time to ensure a quick and smooth admission at the time of your choosing, or they can purchase tickets in person upon arrival. Your multi-pass means you can enter flexibly, though you may still have to wait if the exhibition has reached capacity. Multi-pass ticket holders

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will need to show ID along with their ticket to our Visitor Hosts prior to entering the exhibition on each visit.

Are *Facing Modernity: Degas to Picasso* and the *Archibald Prize* on display at the same time?

From 5 – 20 September, *Facing Modernity: Degas to Picasso* and the *Archibald Prize 2026* are both on display at SAM. For these dates, we have a special double-pass ticket enabling visitors to see both exhibitions in the same visit within a two-hour time slot. We highly recommend you book double-pass tickets well in advance because these tickets are likely to sell out.

Which exhibition do I view first with my double-pass ticket?

If you have a strong preference for viewing *Facing Modernity* or the *Archibald Prize 2026* first, we recommend you arrive 10-15 minutes prior to your timeslot and let our Visitor Hosts know when you arrive. Once one of the exhibitions reaches capacity, the next visitors to arrive are guided to the alternate exhibition.

Once you have finished viewing the first exhibition, you are welcome to take a break; however, please note the two-hour time slot provided for viewing both exhibitions.

Can I use my multi-pass ticket to see *Facing Modernity: Degas to Picasso* and the *Archibald Prize 2026* during the same visit?

Yes, from 5 – 20 September you may use your multi-pass to view both exhibitions. Viewing both exhibitions during a visit count as **two visits** on your multi-pass.

I don't want to use all my multi-pass visits for *Facing Modernity*. Can I use it to visit *Archibald Prize 2026*?

Yes, the multi-pass can be used a total of five times from 23 May to 1 November to enter our ticketed exhibitions *Facing Modernity: Degas to Picasso* and *Archibald Prize 2026*. You may choose to visit *Facing Modernity* just once and use the remaining four admissions on your pass to visit *Archibald Prize 2026* four times, or vice-versa.

A visit to *Facing Modernity: Degas to Picasso* and *Archibald Prize 2026* on the same date will count as two admissions on your pass.

Are there pass-outs?

Visitors will be allowed to exit and re-enter the Gallery to use the bathroom, answer phone calls, and for health and access needs only. Pass-outs to re-enter in another timeslot or after a coffee break will not be available.

Do I need a ticket to view the other exhibitions and displays at SAM?

No. During *Facing Modernity*, entry to SAM and our other exhibitions will still be free, except for the *Archibald Prize 2026*, which begins

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from 5 September. Please visit our website to view our [current exhibitions](#).

Are ticket refunds available?

Yes, ticket refunds are available up to 1 day prior to the event, and in exceptional circumstances. You can request a refund by using the Contact Host option within the Humanitix Ticketing system on the confirmation email you received from order@humanitix.com after purchasing your tickets. Ensure you include all necessary information such as your Order ID, Name, and details of the request. Can I exchange my ticket for another date or timeslot?

Yes, you can change your ticket for another date or timeslot prior up until the time of the booking, subject to ticket capacity. You can request a date/time change by using Contact Host option on the confirmation email you received from order@humanitix.com after purchasing your tickets. Select 'Update information on the ticket/order' and ensure you include all necessary information such as your Order ID, Name, and details of the request.

I am running late for my timeslot, what should I do?

If you are running late to meet the start time of your timed ticket, your ticket is still valid. Please note that you may not have immediate entry when you arrive at SAM and may need to wait in queue until space becomes available in the gallery. Our Visitor Hosts will advise you when you arrive, but there is no need to call or contact SAM if you are running late.

Group Bookings and Tours

Are group bookings and tours available?

Yes. Group bookings are available for community and social groups of 10 or more visitors, priced at \$19 per person. SAM is offering guided tours for group bookings on Monday – Thursday from 1 June onwards, priced at an additional \$5 per person. All group bookings and tours must be arranged in advance with our bookings team.

Are school bookings available?

Yes. School bookings for *Facing Modernity* are available for exclusive before-hours guided tours on weekdays starting from 9:15am, or for self-guided visits during normal hours. Are there any public tours scheduled?

Yes. SAM's Community Voices program is scheduled each day at 2:30pm, with short 5-to-10-minute talks focusing on select artworks in *Facing Modernity* delivered by members of the Greater Shepparton community. These talks can be attended at no additional cost by valid 2pm ticket holders. There are also guided tours at 3pm on select Saturdays throughout the exhibition, which can be attended at no additional cost by valid ticket holders. Transportation and Parking

How do I get to Shepparton Art Museum?

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Shepparton Art Museum is located just over 2 hours' drive north-east of Melbourne, 1.5 hours East of Bendigo and 1 hour West of Wangaratta.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

V/Line trains and coaches run numerous times a day from Southern Cross Train Station in Melbourne to Shepparton. To purchase tickets, for travel information and up-to-date timetables, visit the V/line [website](#) or phone 1800 800 007.

Shepparton Station doesn't yet have a Myki reader, so you need to buy a paper ticket when catching V/Line trains.

From Shepparton Railway Station, it takes approx. 22 minutes to walk to Shepparton Art Museum (1.4 kilometres). Alternatively, you can take the 5 Bus from Shepparton Railway Station/Purcell St two stops to Swallow Street/Johnson St and then walk 800 metres. We encourage you to cross the road safely at the traffic lights on the corner of Wyndham St and Sobraon St. To plan your journey, visit Transport Victoria's [Journey Planner](#).

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SHUTTLE BUS

For V/Line passengers, complimentary shuttle buses to and from Shepparton Railway Station and the museum are available on the weekends of Saturday 23 and Sunday 24 May, and Saturday 6 and Sunday 7 June.

LOCAL BUS, TAXI OR UBER

Buses and taxis operate a regular service throughout Greater Shepparton. Local bus timetables are available from the Greater Shepparton Visitor Centre, whilst taxis can be booked by calling (03) 5822 2214. Ubers are readily available in Shepparton and can be booked via the Uber App.

Where do I park?

All-day, free parking can be found at our onsite carpark on Fitzjohn Street, and in timed parking in the driving loop on the south side of the building. Cars can also be parked on Wyndham Street.

Disabled parking is available in the driving loop on the south side of the building, outside of the Visitor Centre. Disabled parking is also available within our Fitzjohn Street carpark. Information on additional parking nearby will be updated shortly.



Facilities

Where are the toilets?

Toilets, including gender-neutral, all abilities, male and female, are located on Level 1 and Level 4 of our building. There are additional toilets, including a Changing Places accessible toilet, outside of the SAM building, next to the Sir Andrew & Lady Fairley Amphitheatre on the west side of the precinct.

Is cloak available?

Yes, cloak services are available at the Ticket Desk on the Ground Floor of the SAM building. Backpacks, umbrellas and large bags are not permitted within the exhibition and must be cloaked prior to entry.

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Accessibility

Is Shepparton Art Museum wheelchair accessible?

For visitors with physical needs, or who use a wheelchair, our main entrance on Wyndham Street is equipped with a step-free automatic door at street level. Each level is accessible via lift, and All Abilities toilets can be found on Levels 1 and 4 of our building. A wheelchair is available for hire at our Ground Level - we recommend you call us ahead of time on (03) 4804 0000 to secure it ahead of your visit.

Do you have baby changing facilities?

Yes. Nappy changing facilities can be found in the All-Abilities bathrooms on Level 1 and Level 4, as well as in the external toilet facilities next to the outdoor amphitheatre. SAM is a breastfeeding-friendly facility, and every level of the building can be accessed via lift for families with prams. Prams are welcome within our gallery spaces. Please enquire at our front desk for access to our cloakroom facility.

SAM has a Quiet Room that can be accessed with a swipe card to visitors to use. Please see SAM Visitor Hosts on our Ground Level for location and access.

A Changing Places bathroom is located outside of the SAM building on the west side of the precinct. It can be accessed by following the footpath from the main carpark past Kaiela Arts and the Amphitheatre. Changing Places are fully accessible toilets with full-sized change table, hoist system and basin, designed for the exclusive use of people with disability, their families and carers.

Users are asked to bring their Master Locksmith Access Key (MLAK) to open. For health and safety reasons, slings are not provided and visitors are asked to bring their own which should be compatible with the loop system. The facility is available to use 24/7.

Are large-print versions of exhibition texts available?

Yes, there are a limited number of booklets with the exhibition labels in large print. These can be picked up from SAM Visitor Hosts on Level 1 outside the exhibition entry. Please return the booklet once you are finished.

Is there an exhibition audio guide?

Yes, an audio guide for *Facing Modernity* can be accessed via QR code on a smartphone inside the exhibition. If you need help accessing the audio guide, please ask our friendly Visitor Hosts. Visitors will need to bring their own headphones.

What other access resources do you have?

SAM has a **Quiet Room**, located on our Ground Level, available to anyone who needs a calm and private space during their visit to SAM. Our quiet room can be used for:

- Feeding and nursing your baby
- Prayer
- Visitors with sensory needs seeking a quiet space

The room is furnished with a chair, a small table, and a selection of children's books. To access the room, please collect a swipe card from the staff at the Ticket Desk on the ground floor.

Please note: The quiet room is a small space that permits one user and carer/s at a time. It is prioritised for parents, visitors with sensory or access needs, or for private worship. No smoking or vaping is permitted.

Entry Policies

Is it ok to take photos?

Yes, visitors may take photos in the gallery unless it is stated otherwise. Photography must be for personal, non-commercial use only. Please note the following:

- The use of flash/lighting, tripods, monopods, and selfie sticks is not permitted

- It is your responsibility to ensure copyright and other laws are not infringed
- Photography of some loan paintings in the main galleries may be restricted, as indicated by signs beside the paintings
- Filming requires prior permission – please chat with SAM Staff if you intend to vlog or record your experience in our gallery.
- Photography or filming of children and young people under 18 is prohibited without consent of the accompanying adult.

Please respect the wishes of all visitors by not obstructing the view of the artworks or taking pictures of anyone without their consent.

Are food and drinks permitted in the exhibition?

No, food and drinks are strictly prohibited in the exhibition and throughout the SAM building, including ticket queues. If you have purchased coffee from the café, we ask you enjoy this in the café or outside prior to queuing for the exhibition.

Can I use a pram, stroller, walking frame or wheelchair in the exhibition?

Yes, pram, strollers, walking frames and wheelchairs can be taken into the exhibition.

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
